The aim of this message is to invite you to participate in the scheduled Mini-Symposium **MS 11** on **Experimental techniques**. This Mini-Symposium is organized to review the progress in experimental investigations in dynamics (including laser vibrometry, thermography, wave propagation, acoustic emission, fibre optics, vibration based methods, determination of material properties based on dynamic responses, application to shock and impact, nondestructive testing evaluation and fault detection, and other methods). The Mini-Symposium is created as a platform for all researchers and scientists to share their latest findings, learn more about technological developments in the field, and cement friendships.

If you would like to take part in this Mini-Symposium you are invited to submit online your one-page abstract before June 30th, 2010. The abstract must be submitted through the Website of the conference (and not sent to the Mini-Symposium organizers). A Word template (template.doc) can be used for your abstract. Authors are asked to identify the number of our Mini-Symposium. As a general rule, we will accept one paper per registered author.

The abstracts submitted to the Mini-Symposium would be reviewed and the review process will be ended at 31 August 2010. Final decision (accept/reject, oral or poster presentation) will be communicated to the authors by the Conference Secretariat before 30 September 2010. Authors of accepted abstracts will be invited to submit their final paper before 31 December 2010.
